Qualification Overview

This course is designed for individuals who want to work in community, home, or residential care settings. You will be part of a dynamic multi-disciplinary team, providing personalised support to people who may need assistance due to ageing, disability, or other reasons.

You will learn how to follow individualised care plans to deliver person-centred support. You will learn how to take charge of your own responsibilities within your job role, you will apply a mix of factual, technical, and procedural knowledge, with knowledge based theory, to provide effective individualised support to the clients.

Throughout the course, you will apply these skills in line with Commonwealth and State/Territory laws, Australian standards, and industry codes of practice.

As part of the qualification, you will need to complete a minimum of 120 hours of workplace training in aged care facilities, as outlined in the assessment requirements of competency units.

After completing this qualification, you will be equipped with knowledge and skills to perform various roles in the aged care and disability sector, including:

- Personal Care Worker
- Assistant in Nursing
- Support Worker
- Respite Worker
- Community Care Worker

Diploma of Community Services

Qualification Overview

This course is designed to enable you to make a positive impact in the community. You will learn how to navigate in the world of community services in the Australian society, learning how to deliver personalised support services and assistance to individuals, groups, and communities.

Throughout the course, you will develop specialised skills in community services, gaining the ability to work independently with guidance from senior management. Your role will involve helping people make positive changes in their lives, enhancing both personal and social well-being. You will learn how to provide supervision and support to co-workers and volunteers, and taking on responsibilities in case management and support services coordination. You will apply your skills in line with Commonwealth and State or Territory laws, Australian standards, and industry codes of practice.

As part of the qualification, you will need to complete a minimum of 200 hours of workplace training in community services organisations, as outlined in the assessment requirements of competency units.
