Notes

1. Fee Caveat - The Student tuition fees are indicative only and are subject to change given individual circumstances at enrolment. Additional fees may apply such as Student service and resource fees. The final fee will be calculated based on the units selected. A final itemised invoice/statement will be issued upon confirmation of enrolment. There is no enrolment fee for government funded programs.
2. Students may withdraw from the course/unit before the census date without any penalty fees. Please refer to our Refund Policy on the terms and conditions of enrolment on the government funded student application form. The census date for individual units are listed on the itemised invoice/statement.
3. For secondary school aged persons not enrolled at school, the maximum course fee chargeable is \$420. The maximum course fee is the total fee for all courses the student is enrolled in. In 2022 these students will be born on or after 1 July 2004. Notice of Arrangement Form is required to be completed before confirmation of enrolment.

Eligibility for Government Funded Training Programs

Australian citizens and permanent residents are eligible for government funded training programs and persons holding one of the following visa types are to be treated as Australian residents for fee charging purposes:

1. Persons holding a temporary visa of sub-class 309, 444, 785, 790, or 820 visa;
2. Secondary holders of a temporary visa of sub-class 457;
3. Holders of a Bridging Visa E (subclasses 050 and 051) where the visa holder has made a valid application for a visa of subclass 785 or 790; and
4. New Zealand passport holders

NOTE: Holders of other bridging visas and other visa sub-classes are NOT eligible. Domestic Fee for Service Fees will apply until the eligible visa is granted.

Eligibility For Lower Fees, Local Skills – effective from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022

1. The annual course fee cap is \$400 for concession students and people aged 15-24 years.
2. The annual course fee cap for non-concession students is \$1,200.
3. All students aged 15-24 years of age are eligible for the annual concession course fee cap of \$400 per qualification per course per year.
4. Lower fees, local skills course fees apply whether you study full time, part time or even online for these priority qualifications.

Eligibility for Concession Fees

The following students are entitled to the concession rate on course fees:

- a) Persons and dependents of persons holding:
 - i. A Pensioner Concession Card;
 - ii. A Repatriation Health Benefits Card issued by the Department of Veterans' Affairs;
 - iii. A Health Care Card.
- b) Persons and dependents of persons for whom the Commonwealth's JobKeeper payments are being received.
- c) Persons and dependents of persons in receipt of services from the following Commonwealth support or employment services programs:
 - i. Jobactive;
 - ii. Online Employment Services; or
 - iii. ParentsNext.
- d) Persons and dependent of persons in receipt of the Youth Allowance, AUSTUDY or ABSTUDY.
- e) Persons and dependent of persons who are inmates of a custodial institution.
- f) Secondary school aged persons, not enrolled at school.

For the Jobactive, Online Employment Services, or the ParentsNext program, appropriate evidence of a student's eligibility for concession is a letter from the Commonwealth services provider confirming the student's participation in the program.

If the concession is valid for the full enrolment period, then all eligible units the student enrolls in within that period attract the concession rate. If the concession is valid for part of the enrolment period, then only eligible units the student enrolls in on or after the start date and prior to the expiry of the concession attract the concession rate.

Eligible "Fees Cap" students are eligible for the annual concession course fee of \$400 per qualification per course per year.

Application for Fee Waive

APSI may waive all fees and charges for students that they assess as being in severe financial hardship for below diploma level courses only. Whether a student is in severe financial hardship is to be determined on a case by case basis by APSI. A separate Fee Waive Application Form with all supporting evidence must be submitted before the enrolment is confirmed.



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
